

#### Why the Protocol Requirement?

- Animals are utilized for research, training, or testing is conducted under authority or directive of the university, regardless of funding sources
- IACUC review and approve animal use



#### What does the IACUC look for in the Protocol?




- IACUC looks to ensure that the protocol is consistent with Washington University policy and upholds the highest animal welfare standards
  - Animal Welfare Act
  - Public Health Policy
  - Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals




#### Some of the Specific Stuff

- Justification and rationale for proposed animal use and numbers
- Training and experience of personnel performing procedures
- Detailed descriptions of procedures
- Appropriate perioperative care
- Search for alternatives
- Clear endpoints and humane methods of euthanasia
- Consider the impact to the animals' well-being vs scientific benefit







- Administrative
- Veterinary Verification and Consultation (VVC)
- Designated Member Review
- Full Committee Review





#### **Administrative Review**



- Personnel Changes
  - Non-USDA covered personnel
  - Non-PI changes
- Existing Use Location Changes
- Funding Changes
- Numbers Increase
  - Non-USDA covered species
  - 30% increase limit
  - One-Time

#### Veterinary Verification and Consultation(VVC)




- Anesthesia, analgesia, or sedation, related changes
- USDA Covered Species Administrative Changes
- Experimental substance administration route changes and concentrations
- Duration, frequency, type of procedural changes as described in the policy
- Euthanasia Methods



# **Cycle One-Administrative and Veterinarian Review**



- IACUC Office Staff
  - Completeness
  - Training Requirements

- Veterinarian Review
  - Proper Procedure Descriptions
  - Pain Intervention
  - Endpoint Criteria
  - Drug Appropriateness and Dosages

## **Cycle 2- Designated Member Review (DMR)**



- Option for to call For FCR
- Primary Reviewers
  - Ask for Revisions
  - Can approve
- Secondary Reviewers
  - Ask for Revisions
  - Call for FCR

- Committee Member Review
  - More Comments
  - Recommend Approval
  - Office Approval and Letter

  - Consultation call the IACUC

### **Full Committee Review (FCR)**

- Full Committee Review (FCR)
  - Meets Monthly
  - Multiple survival surgeries
  - Novel experimental models
  - Death as an end point
  - Animal welfare concerns

  - Meets Monthly








